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
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BEING QUEER IS NOT NEW...

- **RUSSIA**: The indigenous Chukchi people in Siberia identified seven genders in addition to male and female.
- **DEM. REP. OF CONGO 16**th**-17**th **century**: Men who acted and dressed in a manner considered feminine and women who acted and dressed in a manner considered masculine, were identified as kitesha.
- CHINA 1st century BCE 17th century CE: Homosexuality was considered a sign of cultural elitism, was not persecuted and has been documented as early as the Qin, Han and Tang dynasties in poetry and songs.
- EGYPT 24th century BCE: The ancient Egyptian royal servants Niankhkhnum and Khnumhotep are believed to be among the first recorded same-sex couple in history, as reflected by the drawings on their tomb.





THE POLITICAL LANDSCAPE LENS

First time in law that male homosexuality was targeted in Britain, outlawing sodomy that was punishable by death until 1861.

Buggery Act

of 1533

Made any male homosexual act illegal – whether or not a witness was present.

Criminal Law

Recommended that 'homosexual behaviour between consenting adults in private should be no longer a criminal offence'

Wolfenden

1957

Report

Partially legalised same-sex acts in the UK between men over the age of 21 conducted in private.

Offenses Act

Sexual

Banned local authorities from 'promoting homosexuality' or 'pretended family relationships', and prohibited councils from funding educational materials and projects perceived to 'promote homosexuality'

Section 28 of the Local Govt Act

1988 (2003)

Gave trans people full legal recognition of their gender.

Gender Recognition Act

Same-sex couples could legally enter into binding partnerships.


Civil Partnerships Act

Gave LGBT employees protections from discrimination, harassment and victimisation at work.

Section 28 of the 1988 Local Government Act stated:

- 'A Local Authority shall not:
- (a) intentionally promote homosexuality or publish material with the intention of promoting homosexuality;
- (b) promote the teaching in any maintained school of the acceptibility of homosexuality as a pretended family relationship. Nothing above shall be taken to prohibit the doing of anything for the purpose of treating or preventing the spread of disease'.
